Poison Hemlock *Conium maculatum*

EARLY DETECTION & CONTROL WILL PREVENT INFESTATIONS!

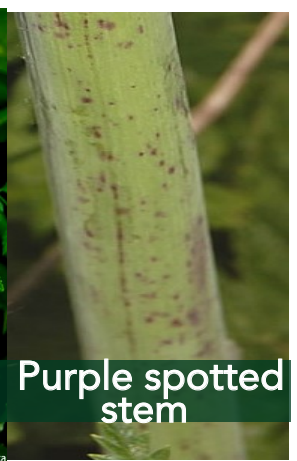

Poison hemlock (biennial) is a deadly poisonous plant of the carrot family. All parts are poisonous to humans and other animals. Dead stems remain poisonous for up to 3 years and toxins are absorbed through the skin and by inhalation. Do not INHALE, TOUCH, INGEST, COMPOST, and BURN.

Report suspected plants for professional control.

It spreads by mowing while seeds are present and invades trails, roadsides, railways, grasslands, disturbed habitats and waterways. By Minnesota Statutes, all of the above and below ground of the plant must be destroyed. Transportation, propagation, or sale of these is prohibited except as allowed by Minnesota Statutes.
